PRESIDENT'S CORNER: By John Sabina

Our annual elections will be held at the **June membership meeting on the third Tuesday in June, the 16th**. Electing replacement officers and board members is a key component of keeping our club strong. The four officers each serve for a term of one year. President, John Sabina, and vice-president, Paul Blanchard, are running for another term. Our long-serving secretary, Dick Jacobs, and our Treasurer, Doug Evans, will be stepping down. I want to personally thank each of them publicly for their outstanding service to the club. These are big shoes to fill.

The Secretary shall prepare and preserve minutes of all meetings of the Board of Directors, send notices to members and Directors, correspond on behalf of the Corporation and maintain supplies of business cards, welcome brochures, and membership applications. Harold Green has volunteered to run for secretary.

The Treasurer shall have custody of the funds of the Corporation and be responsible for the disbursement of its monies. The treasurer shall also keep or cause to be

kept records of Corporation property and funds as well as a complete membership roll. We currently have no candidate for this critical job. The club currently banks at a credit union in Troy, but our accounts could be moved to a different location for the convenience of the treasurer. Curt Chastain has expressed an interest in the position and a willingness to help set up a simple system, but finds that his travel plans will put him out of town for key treasurer time periods. Doug Evans has also offered to assist the next treasurer. You do not have to be a CPA for this job and help is available. A simple Quicken account that mimics a manual checkbook would meet all of the requirements and produce all required reports very easily.



The Board of Directors shall be responsible for the overall policy and operation of the Corporation. Thus, board members oversee the business operation of the club. Directors serve a term of office of two years. Two directors positions are open this year and three directors, Rizal Baysa, Gerry Galanek, and Larry Lloyd have another year on their terms. Delores Lloyd will not be running for reelection due to grandchildren conflicts. Gary Bityk will be running for reelection. As president, I have given up on trying to hold board meetings just before each membership meeting except when a quick decision may be required. Instead, we will hold quarterly board meetings separate from the membership meetings.

Nominations for any officer or board opening will be accepted from the floor before the meeting. No one will be upset to have more than one candidate for each opening. So, please give some thought to these opportunities and plan on being at the June meeting so that your vote counts.

One last topic on the business side deserves mention. Our operating costs continue to rise and our dues remain at \$15 per year. This dues level does not quite cover our very basic expenses. Your MWCA membership, meeting room rental costs, and newsletter costs exceed your dues payment. With yet another increase in first-class postage, we are offering the option of receiving your monthly newsletter via e-mail instead of via hard copy. The electronic newsletter format is the same one used to send the paper to our printer, a .pdf file. This file is universally read by different computers using free, downloaded Adobe

Reader software. Seventeen people have already signed up to receive their newsletter electronically. If you want to try this approach, please contact either the writer or our editor. We will certainly continue to mail newsletters for those who need or prefer that approach, but ask that you consider the electronic distribution. Each electronic copy saves one mailing or \$4.30 per member per year, as well as a slight reduction in printing costs.

We plan on starting the project at the Evert round-up and collecting finished carvings at the Evert spit & whittle in September. Please remember "Pop" has asked us to make sure the carvings are not toooo big as they have to hang on a tree branch.
